RECTOR'S REFLECTION: REMEMBERING WELL

We've been doing a lot of remembering lately. There are two ways to remember, one healthy, one unhealthy. There is *grateful remembrance* that is joyful and hopeful, though not necessarily absent of sorrow. It is the experience of one who has been empowered by the past and so is confidently open to what God will bring next. It trusts that God is good at all times. It proves its knowledge of the past by discovering the same old gifts in new forms. Then there is *ungrateful remembrance*. It clings to the past and refuses to move forward. It does not truly know the blessings of the past because it cannot see their presence today. It forgets that past blessings were at one time strange and unexpected. This form of remembrance is unhealthy. It only leads to disappointment and resentment. On this Remembrance Sunday, let us remember well.
